

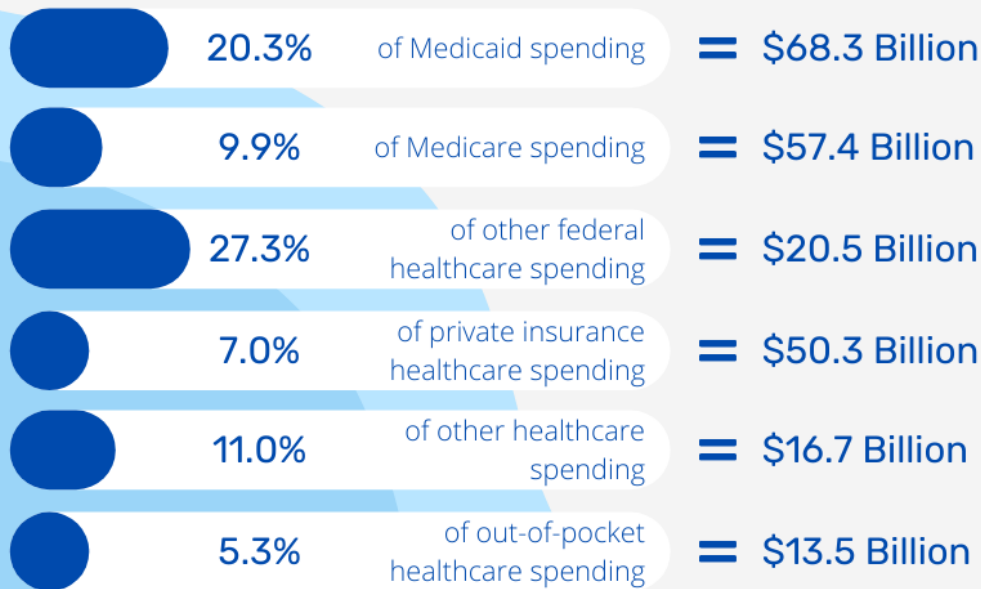
Of the \$226.7 billion in healthcare spending attributable to adult cigarette smoking,
