

California's Proposition 31

What does Proposition 31 state?

a tobacco retailer, or any of the tobacco retailer's agents or employees, shall not sell, offer for sale, or possess with the intent to sell or offer for sale, a flavored tobacco product.

Flavored Tobacco = tobacco product with a characterizing flavor other than tobacco flavor



Who proposed the referendum?

The initiators of the referendum are required to file a list of their **top funders for disclosure** either on the petition or in a separate document presented to signers.



The disclosed top funders for this referendum are tobacco companies R.J. Reynolds and Philip Morris

How did Proposition 31 come about?

- On August 28, 2020, California became the second state in the nation to pass a broad law prohibiting the sale of most flavored tobacco products (SB 793).
- 3 days after the law's passage, a proposed referendum against the law was submitted to the state Attorney General.
- That referendum is qualified for the ballot, and is pending the referendum vote in the November 2022 general election.

What is a Referendum?

Under California's
Constitution, California
voters can propose
referendums to approve or
reject statutes enacted by
the legislature.

List of flavored products that would be banned under Prop. 31

- Menthol cigarettes
- Chewing tobacco
- Snuff
- Little cigars
- Cigarillos
- E-cigarettes
- Roll-your-own tobacco



List of flavored products that would not be banned under Prop. 31

Pipe tobacco

Applies to loose leaf tobacco, defined as "cut or shredded pipe tobacco, usually sold in pouches."

Premium Cigars

Cigars that are handmade, have a tobacco leaf wrapper; have a wholesale price of no less than \$12; not have a filter, tip, or nontobacco mouthpiece; and be capped by

hand.

<u> Hookah + Shisha</u>

Must be sold by a licensed hookah tobacco retailer that limits entry to those aged 21 and over; does not apply to electronic hookahs.

What can YOU do to turn Proposition 31 into a reality?

The California Flavored Tobacco Products Ban Referendum is on the ballot in California on **November 8, 2022.**



A "Yes" vote is to pass Proposition 31, which would ban the sale of flavored tobacco products.
