

MAP OF ENDGAME SUCCESS
















LAND USE

- 200,000 hectares of land cleared annually
- 4 million hectares of arable land affected, particularly in food-insecure countries





ENVIRONMENTAL **IMPACT OF TOBACCO SUPPLY CHAIN**

DEFORESTATION

- 50 million trees chopped to cure tobacco
- 600 million trees used annually
- Contributes to 5% of global deforestation



WASTE

- 2 million tons of packaging in 2021
- Classified as toxic hazardous waste

RESOURCE CONSUMPTION

• 22 billion tonnes of water

• 84 million tonnes of CO2 emitted annually



POLLUTION

- 4.5 trillion nonbiodegradable cigarette butts
- Nicotine devices: single-use, nonrecyclable, with toxic batteries



FCTC/COP10(14) Implementation of Article 18 of the WHO FCTC

The Conference of the Parties (COP),

Considering Article 18 of the WHO Framework Convention on Tobacco Control (WHO FCTC), whereby the Parties agreed to have due regard to the protection of the environment and the health of persons in relation to the environment in respect of tobacco cultivation and manufacture within their respective territories;

56/117. Plastic pollution implications for the full enjoyment of human rights

At its 36th meeting, on 11 July 2024, the Human Rights Council decided to adopt the text below:

"The Human Rights Council,

Recalling General Assembly resolution 60/251 of 15 March 2006 and Human Rights Council resolution 5/1 of 18 June 2007 on institution-building of the Council, which established the Human Rights Council Advisory Committee to function as a think tank for the Council and to work at its direction,

Noting that the Advisory Committee may propose within the scope of the work set out by the Human Rights Council, for the latter's consideration and approval, suggestions for further enhancing its procedural efficiency, as well as further research proposals within the scope of the work set out by the Council,

Noting with appreciation the work of the intergovernmental negotiating committee established by the United Nations Environment Assembly in its resolution 5/14 of 2 March 2022, with the mandate to develop an international legally binding instrument on plastic pollution, including in the marine environment, based on a comprehensive approach that addresses the full life cycle of plastic, taking into account, among other things, the principles of the Rio Declaration on Environment and Development, as well as national circumstances and capabilities,

1. Requests the Human Rights Council Advisory Committee to prepare a comprehensive study on the implications of plastic pollution for the full enjoyment of human rights, based on a comprehensive approach that addresses the full life cycle of plastic, and to present the study to the Human Rights Council at its sixty-sixth session;

2. Also requests the Advisory Committee, when preparing the abovementioned study, to seek the views of and inputs from and to take into account work already done by relevant stakeholders, including States, United Nations agencies, funds and programmes within their respective mandates, international and regional organizations, the Office of the United Nations High Commissioner for Human Rights, the special procedures of the Human Rights Council, the treaty bodies, national human rights institutions, Indigenous Peoples, civil society, environmental human rights defenders, the private sector, academia and scientific institutions."

[Adopted without a vote.]





COP10 Accomplishments Fuel COP11 Goals

- Article 18 (Environment) Decision: recognizing the extensive harm caused to the environment by the entire lifecycle of the cigarette, from production to use and disposal including the environmental impact of filters.
- <u>Human Rights Decision</u>: encourages Parties to consider including WHO FCTC principles and implementation efforts when engaging with the United Nations human rights mechanisms.
- Article 19 (Liability): re-established an expert group on liability, to help inform Parties on how to use civil and criminal laws to take legal action against the tobacco industry.
- <u>Article 2.1 on Forward Looking Measures (Tobacco Endgame) Decision</u>: an Expert group was established to explore cutting-edge policies which go beyond minimum FCTC measures and report back to COP11. This will support progress towards the tobacco endgame.




